Fluoroscopy Policy



Radiologic Technology Program

Students are not allowed to assist or perform fluoroscopic exams without the direct supervision of a radiologist/ physician.

Students are not allowed to use the fluoroscopic equipment to take a preliminary/scout film for any exam, including arthrograms or spotting of the terminal ileum for a small bowel follow through.

REMINDER:

INDIRECT SUPERVISION:

JRCERT interprets "indirect supervision of students" as the supervision provided by a qualified radiographer immediately available to assist a student regardless of the level of student competency achievement. "Immediately available" is interpreted as the presence of a qualified radiographer adjacent to the room or location where a radiographic procedure is being performed. This applies to all areas where ionizing radiation equipment is in use. This does not include communication by any mobile/electronic device including cell phones and pagers.

DIRECT SUPERVISION:

The parameters of Direct Supervision according to the JRCERT are:

A qualified radiographer:

- 1. reviews the request for examination
- 2. evaluates the condition of the patient
- 3. is present during the conduct of the examination
- 4. review and approves radiographs

Remember that students must have direct supervision on all portable and surgical procedures, as well as on ANY repeat exam that was completed with indirect supervision.
