The INDIAN HILLS COMMUNITY COLLEGE Student Support Services (SSS) Program has assisted students for the past 30 years. Our program, one of only 1,069 SSS programs in the nation, accepts 225 students each year to receive services. Over the years, more than 5,000 Indian Hills students have benefited from the activities of the SSS program:

Students' skills have been improved through skill building classes in reading, writing, math, algebra, study skills and career planning.

Classes may be taken on an individual basis or in a classroom setting.

Students have been served through transfer activities.

Many Indian Hills students go on to four-year colleges after graduating from IHCC. Transfer activities assist students in selecting

the best college for them and in completing the steps to enroll in the new college. SSS provides information on colleges nationwide. In addition to other colleges, the program schedules visits twice each year to Iowa State University, the University of Iowa and the University of Northern Iowa so that our students can learn more about these Iowa universities. Workshops are held each term to provide participants with transfer guidance.

Students have been served with special cultural activities.

Each year the Arts and Sciences Department sponsors a weekend trip to a major city to visit an Art Institute and attend a play or musical event. SSS has provided assistance so that several of the SSS participants could participate in the trip. In addition, bus trips to attend plays and musicals in Des Moines and Iowa City have been arranged. Over the past several years participants have seen The Addams Family, Lion King, Chicago, Wicked, The Phantom of the Opera, Mamma Mia and other great shows.

Students have been served with additional financial aid.

Active SSS participants who receive PELL grants are eligible to apply for additional grants through the SSS program.

Be a part of the Student Support Services program!

Applying for the program is simple; the application form is included with this information. Complete the SSS application and return it to the Student Support Services Offices. You may fold the application so that the Indian Hills Community College return address shows, tape the form closed and drop it in the mail.

Remember, you may be eligible in any one of the three eligibility areas: First Generation, Low Income or Disabled. The shaded questions on the application are critical information needed to process your application.

The Student Support Services Program is part of the TRIO family of programs funded through a grant from the U.S. Department of Education to work with 225 students each year.

STUDENT **SUPPORT SERVICES PROGRAM**

The Student Support Services Program provides assistance in academics, counseling, and cultural enrichment to its participants to keep students on track for graduation and/or transfer to a four-year college.

- Financial Aid Assistance.
- Career planning assistance and personality, ability and interest testing.
- Assistance in deciding on a college major.
- One-on-one counseling and personal assistance.
- Assistance in transfering to a four-year college, including college visits and transfer manual.
- *Newsletters full of information about campus events,* transferring to four-year colleges, reminders of scholarship deadlines and other vital college survival information.
- Free cultural events. Events include admission and trasportation to plays or musicals.
- Face-to-face and online tutoring.

To be eligible, you must meet one of these three qualifications:

- 1. First-generation college student (Neither parent has graduated with a four-year degree).
- 2. Student with a documented disability (Documentation with Indian Hills Community College Special Needs Department or with Vocational Rehabilitation).
- 3. Low income (Total family income is below 150% of the poverty guidelines).
