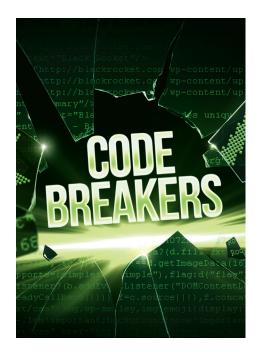


Bubbles, Bubbles & More Bubbles
