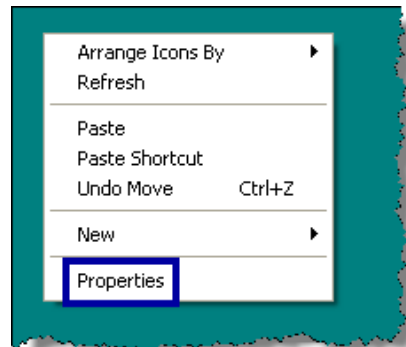
How To: **Change Your Screen Resolution**

Purpose: To properly view our computer tutorials, the resolution on your computer monitor should be 1024 x 768 or higher. Otherwise, the tutorial will not fit on your screen.

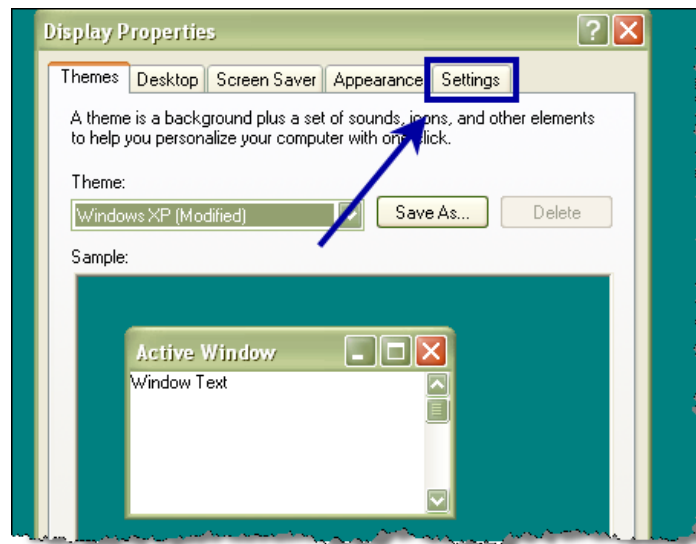
Introduction: Increasing your screen resolution allows you to see more content on the computer screen. Decreasing it causes you to see less, but the icons and text are larger. You can always change your resolution back to its original setting or experiment with other resolutions to find what is most comfortable for you.

Change Your Screen Resolution:

1. Right-click with your mouse anywhere on your desktop.
2. Select the **Properties** menu item.



3. The **Display Properties** window opens.



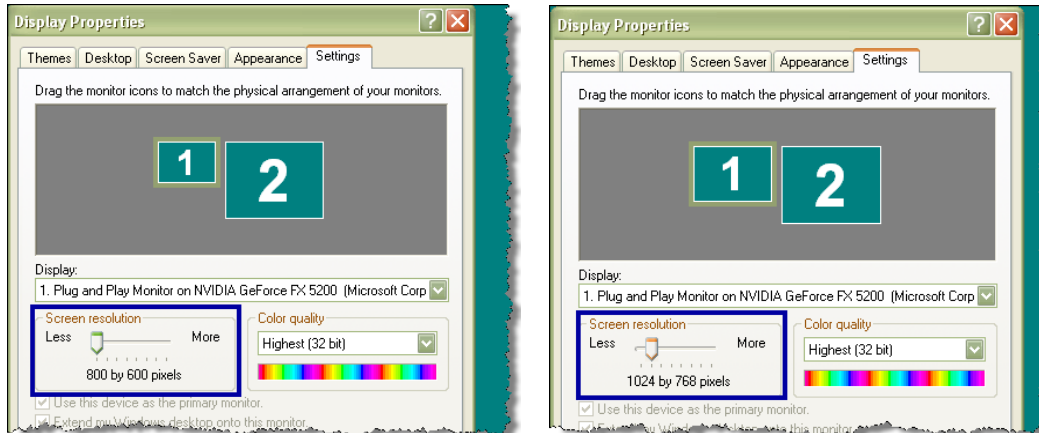
4. Click the **Settings** tab.



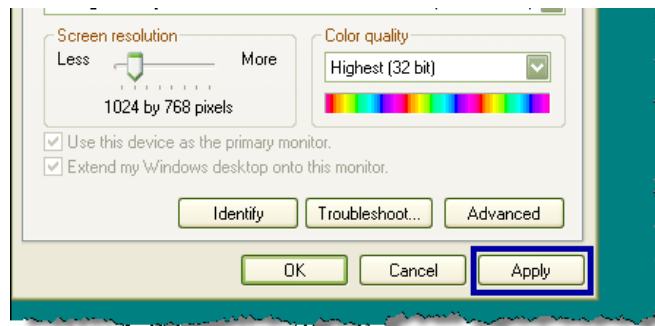
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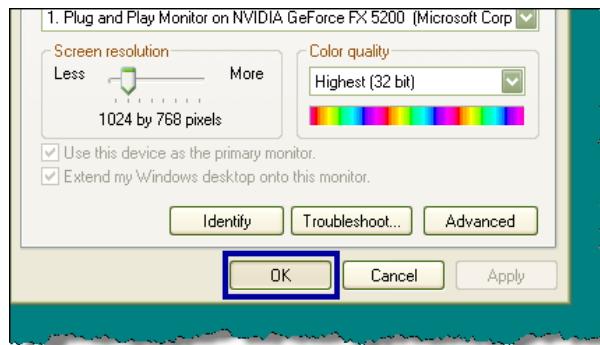
- Click and drag the “Screen resolution” slider toward “Less” or “More” to decrease or increase your screen resolution. Optimally, it should be set at 1024 x 768 or “more.”



- Click the **Apply** button.



- Click the **OK** button.



Your screen resolution has been changed.
