



Faculty Tutorial:

Getting Started with Respondus LockDown Browser and Respondus Monitor

Overview

An ongoing concern in online education is ensuring the validity of online testing. In short, how can we be sure students aren't cheating and that the student who has registered for the course is the one actually taking the test? In order to be able to provide high-quality online courses to our students, we need to be able to address this issue. The following is one method that Indian Hills Community College uses for this.

When setting up an online test through MyHills, you may require your students to use the **free Respondus LockDown Browser**. You may also have them use **Respondus Monitor**, which uses a webcam to monitor their activity as they take a test. These two products work together.

Instructions

Please follow the steps below to better understand what LockDown Browser and Respondus Monitor are, how they work, what you need to tell students, and how to set them up in your own courses.

Additional Important Information

- A webcam, as well as audio headphones with a built-in microphone, are requirements listed in the [Computer Standards for IHCC Courses \(PDF\)](#), and have been required for online courses for years. They are also used for online interaction. The webcam can be built into a computer (as is the case with most laptop computers) or it can be the type that plugs into a computer with a USB cable. Suitable webcams and headphones are available for purchase from the [Indian Hills Bookstore](#).
- Supporting information for students, regarding LockDown Browser and Respondus Monitor, is also provided in the “**Before You Begin**” section of every course in MyHills. See the navigation menu on the left side of your course.
- Please provide students the link to the “**Respondus LockDown Browser: Instructions for Students**” PDF, as it includes important information about Respondus, as well as the link that students *must* use to download a copy of LockDown Browser.

IMPORTANT: Students should **not** download a copy of LockDown Browser from elsewhere on the Internet, as those versions will not work at our college. They must use the link provided in the “Instructions for Students” PDF.

- At this time, **on-campus computer labs**, such as those in the Academic Success Center, Testing Center, Centerville Campus, North Campus, and County Service Centers are equipped with LockDown Browser and a limited number of webcams. Students who wish to use these facilities to take tests that require Respondus Monitor should schedule their tests ahead of time with the appropriate facility to ensure webcam availability.
- **Any course** which has online tests in MyHills may make use of the LockDown Browser and Respondus Monitor. However, please keep in mind the bullet item above regarding on-campus computer labs.
- We strongly recommend that you create a simple **practice test** in your course for students to use to test their LockDown Browser and webcam setup without worrying about a grade. Just be sure you let students know what it’s for and put it where they will see it early in the course (perhaps in Learning Unit 1).
